Residents invited as WWI hero finally gets headstone

RESIDENTS have been invited to attend a service this weekend, where a headstone will be officially unveiled for a war hero who has laid in an unmarked grave for 99 years.

Arthur Charles Argent was dis-

Arthur Charles Argent was discharged from the British Army after suffering severe injuries to his left arm in the German spring offensive in March 1918.

He died of pneumonia two years later at the Billericay Isolation Hospital and was buried in the church yard of St Mary's, Little Burstead.

Researcher Karen Dennis has led the campaign to give Mr Argent a proper headstone.

She said: "After he was discharged, he was given an army pension. Those weren't easy to come by, so his wounds must have been pretty severe. On his death certificate he is described as an army pensioner, which suggests he was unable to work when he came home.

"He came from a long line of agricultural labourers. His mother had already died, as had a couple of his siblings. He had a surviving brother, but he had lost

his wife in the flu pandemic and I just don't think they had any money to put up a headstone."

Karen took up researching local war

heroes as a hobby after illness forced her to give up work. She said: "I became very interested in my own family's history and in particular my great uncle, who served in and survived the Great War. Each year we go to the Remembrance Service at the War Memorial and say, 'We will remember them', but when I asked around, nobody really did remember them or know who they were. I started looking into who our local soldiers were who had died and there were two or three I really struggled with. One of them was Arthur Charles Argent."

When Karen finally pinned down who Mr Argent was, she was told Government would not provide a headstone because it could not be proved that his war wounds had contributed to his death

Aided by Reverend Paul Carr and local funeral director Roy Farrer, Janet quickly raised the cash herself.

She said: "Local people and organisations responded very generously. Within three weeks, I had got more than enough funds to secure the headstone for him. So after 99 years, he's not going to be in an unmarked grave anymore."

Members of the Royal Anglian Regiment – successor to the Leicester Regiment, where Mr Argent served – will attend the ceremony at St Mary's at 10.15am on Saturday, June 22.
