¹ After the death of Saul, David returned from striking down the Amalekites and stayed in Ziklag two days. ² On the third day a man arrived from Saul's camp with his clothes torn and dust on his head. When he came to David, he fell to the ground to pay him honour. ³ 'Where have you come from?' David asked him. He answered, 'I have escaped from the Israelite camp.' ⁴ 'What happened?' David asked. Christ Church

Christ Church worships every Sunday in Perry Street, near to the Buttsbury schools. The main morning worship service is at 10 a.m. and has something for all ages. There is a wide range of midweek activities for all ages from Drop-In for seniors, home groups, toddler groups, Twins Club, Dambusters for dads and pre-school, and a Friday youth group.



Emmanuel

Situated in Laindon Road, Emmanuel has an informal and relaxed style. They take church seriously, but enjoy having fun along the way! They offer a place for people of all ages in our Sunday services at 8.30 and 10.30 am with Creche, Kindergarten, Heroes & Trinity Tribe. They is a wide variety of weekly activities ranging from: Uniformed Groups; Mums & Tots; Home Groups; Who Let The Dads Out? Messy Church and much more!



Saint John the Divine

Saint John's has recently undertaken an extension to its kitchen and hall and is located at Outwood Common, to the east of Billericay. Morning Prayer or Holy Communion is celebrated on alternate Sundays. Activities throughout the week include 'Small Wonders' on Tuesday mornings for pre-school children and their parents; 'Café on the Common' on Thursdays and an over 60's 'Midweek Break' group on Wednesdays.



Saint Mary Magdalen 'The Church In The High Street'

Christian's have been worshipping on this site for over 600 years. The latest phase of the church's life began in 1992 when Emmanuel was opened. A period of refurbishment followed and St Mary's was reopened in 2007 as a Chapel of Ease. The building is used by groups such as: Street Pastors; Community Choir; and hosts a Coffee Mornings on a Monday. A service of Holy Communion takes place every Wednesday at 10.00 am.



Saint Mary the Virgin

This late Norman church at Little Burstead stands on a hilltop in open countryside surrounded by a well kept churchyard. It is a popular choice for weddings and there is a committed, regular congregation, with a Robed Choir. Holy Communion or Morning Prayer is celebrated on alternate Sundays. Regular events, such as Coffee Mornings, take place in the Old School in the village.
