

NEW TO PRAYER?

START HERE

We believe that God is a relational God who works in community with us in all things. We see this from creation right through the Bible stories and into our own times. We see this in Jesus who was there at the beginning of time and is still with God; we see this in the Holy Spirit who is available to us now to guide our ways.

Jesus said, 'Come to me' and he calls each of us into a journey of discovery to find the intimate relationship that God wants with each of us. We find this through Prayer, a conversation with God.

God is approachable and prayer is something anyone can do. You don't have to use complicated words or special language. God isn't swayed by long prayers or clever arguments. God knows you more intimately than you know yourself, after all he created you in your mother's womb (Psalm 139).

Be honest, tell him your thoughts worries and desires. Be thankful for all you have and say sorry for anything you regret.

The disciples of Jesus saw him praying and asked him to teach them to pray. He taught them what we now know as 'The Lord's Prayer'. It has everything we need and is a great place to start. The Lord's prayer found in the Gospels of Matthew (6:9-15) and Luke (11:2-4):

Our Father in heaven,
Hallowed be your name,
Your kingdom come,
Your will be done,
On earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
But deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours
Now and forever. Amen.

Sometimes we can be the answer to our own prayers, this means that God may be asking you to do something. Prayer is about listening to God as well as about talking to God. It's a two-way conversation. So why not sit quietly for a while before you pray. Get comfortable, then ask God to help you as you pray. You can use the prayers overleaf or try the links below. But don't forget to leave space for God to speak to you. This may be just a sense of peace or special presence or he may direct your thoughts in some way. Don't expect instant results. God may be saying Yes, no, or wait. Come back to prayer often and you will begin to notice his presence.
