Leader: Lord God, you alone are skilled to know the cure for every sickness,

ailment, disease, situation and every soul. If by our lives your grace may be known, then in us, through us, and, if need be, despite us,

let your kingdom come. AMEN.

Prayers for Healing: Those who are Present

Leader:

Jesus laid hands on the sick and prayed for their healing. He authorised his disciples to follow his example and so we come now to share in this ministry in his name. We come to receive God's healing touch and to be channels of that healing touch for others. Look, Lord on your children, who love your name and need your care. Let your healing touch be known in the touch of friends.

All:

Lord say the word and we shall be healed.

You are invited to form two queues to be anointed with Oil for Healing. Members of the Prayer Ministry Team will be available for individual prayer before, after, or instead of being anointed with oil (as well as during the distribution of Communion). The leader/minister will pray the same prayer for each person coming forward:

Our witness against hunger, our cry against injustice, our celebration of all that is good, and our hope for a world where God is fully known and every child is fed. Thanks be to God.

Prayer of Consecration

Leader:

Lord Jesus Christ, present with us now, for all that you have done and all that you have promised. What have we to offer? Our hands are empty, our hearts are sometimes full of wrong things. We are not fit to gather up the crumbs from under your table. But with you is mercy and the power change.

So as we do in this place what you did in the upstairs room, send down your Holy Spirit on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine. That, as symbols of your body, they may bring healing, forgiveness and make us whole and that we might become, for you, your body loving and caring in the world; until your kingdom comes.

Among friends, gathered round a table, Jesus took bread, broke it and said, 'This is my body. It is broken - for you.' And later he took the cup of wine and said, 'This is the new relationship with God made possible through my death. Take this - all of you.'
